Irvine Road Community Orchard goes live in 2019

We are on track to take on the lease for the Irvine Road Community Orchard in the summer of 2019. This follows IRARA's agreement with the developers Lexden Restorations and the granting of planning permission for 6 houses on 40% of the existing Orchard.

As described in the September newsletter, the lease provides for daytime access to restore and manage the remaining Orchard, for open days and fruit-picking along with school access and evening bat walks on a limited number of days per year. There is also the opportunity to secure a 999 year lease if we can raise £45k in the first five years.

Since Christmas many of you will seen that further clearance work has been undertaken and when this is completed, fences will be erected and the new access road will be laid. As soon as we have a firm programme for these works we will put them on the web-site. Perhaps the

most obvious immediate change is the clearance alongside Shady Lane to be followed by the erection of a site security fence. In due course, this will be replaced by a new hedge backed by garden fences for the new houses.

A message from Lexden Restorations

Lexden Restorations owner, Jonathan Frank has asked us to remind parents to explain the dangers of building sites to their children and ask them not to try and enter the site.

The developers also ask all residents to please bear with them in terms of traffic, lorries etc. They say they are committed to doing everything they can to be considerate neighbours during the construction period, but there will undoubtedly be times when you may be inconvenienced and they apologise in advance for that.

The 2018 IRARA AGM was again well attended and although the new Community Orchard was the main talking point, several other issues were discussed, among them an amendment to the constitution to formally allow associate members from outside the principal IRARA catchment area. It has long been obvious to us that a lot of people living outside the immediate area share our aims of improving local amenities, preserving our open spaces and helping to keep the neighbourhood a nice place to live, but until now they have not been able to join us.

Now anyone can be an associate IRARA member. You won't be able to vote at the AGM, but other than that you can enjoy all the other benefits of membership.

20 is plenty – progress report

It was agreed at the AGM that we should pursue the Area being designated as a 20mph zone. This follows concerns being raised by residents regarding traffic around our streets, and in particular, the risks presented to the high numbers of school children who walk through the area to school.

As a result, Councillor Lissimore arranged for traffic monitoring equipment to be installed for a couple of weeks in November to provide evidence in support of the application. We wait to hear the results.

Footpath between the schools

The public footpath between Philip Morant School and the County High School has been an issue for some years now, and this year we thought we were finally there?

As reported from the previous year's AGM, we understood that the formal designation of the footpath would be confirmed subject to agreement that it would be designated for use as footpath, cycle and equestrian use and limited to 3m in width. However, since that time, St Benedict's School and The County High School have continued to object.



The existing permissive footpath between Philip Morant School and the County High School is in urgent need of improvement and should be formally adopted as a proper footpath to ensure future access.
